

Dyma hen gofnod gydag ymdrech i esbonio'r ffenomenon gan FJ Stubbs yng nghylchgrawn British Birds 1909


On January 24th, 1909, ...in a small wooded valley in south-east Lancashire, we came across a small party of eight birds, and decided to watch them. They were in the branches of a sycamore, and were jumping about and parading in a most ludicrous manner. It would be impossible to describe in a few words the actions of these birds, but there was no room for doubt as to the real meaning of the function. Although crowded together they were evidently in pairs ; one would "show off" to its mate, and when she (?) turned away, he (?) would promptly jump round to be in front of her. Owing to the trim way in which the birds carried themselves (with feathers pressed close to the body) they seemed slimmer, and the legs showed more of the tibiae, than usual. Every few seconds the head-feathers would be rapidly erected and depressed, and the tail uplifted and opened and closed like a fan — an action that I remember noticing in an amorous Jackdaw. The voices of the birds were markedly different from those of other seasons. Sometimes one of these Magpies would leave the others and take a course through the trees in the wood, but it was always followed by a companion. On these journeys they approached within a few feet of our heads; we were greatly struck by the unexpected grace of flight displayed on their amatory excursions.

OUR NOTEBOOK. MACKEREL CATCHING AT PORT EYNON. BY M BREOSA. A few days ago [c. 22 Medi 1894] I took part in a drawing at Port Eynon... mackerel catching with a draw net. Every year the harvest mackerel, as they are called, come in immense shoals into all the bays on these coasts, and they reached Port Eynon Bay about a fortnight ago. The sprats, or butter fish, as the Gower men call them, arrived just before — about a yard in front. ...It was a lovely evening on the Friday when they were first seen. The tide was high, ...and as smooth as a lake, save for a gentle, lazy heave as it began slowly to ebb. Rambling slowly along the smooth firm sands at the foot of the Burrows towards Horton, a silvery flash suddenly caught my eye, then another, and then hundreds of little flashes and ripples. Looking closer, I could see the water dimpled with little black things bobbing up and down. For a moment I could not understand the unusual appearance, but it quickly dawned upon me that the mackerel had come at last. The silver splashes were the unhappy sprats leaping out of the water to escape the fate which awaited them beneath the surface; the black "bobbers" were the heads of the mackerel eagerly following the luckless sprats. The news soon spread. The coming of the mackrel had been awaited some time, for they were later than usual, and the villagers began to stream across from the village to the sands, and to hurry down the hills and over the burrows from Horton. The draw nets—shallow nets about three feet deep, and as long as you please — were soon fetched from the sand-hills, where they had lain in readiness, and then the fun began. One man took one end of the net and walked out into the sea. Another held the other end close in on the beach. I noticed, by the way, that the master played his part, and that it was the man who took the seaward end. When the first man had reached as far as he could get, nearly up to his chin, ha made a circuit, and then came slowly ashore with the end of the net. Thus, the net formed a semi-circle in the Sea, with both ends on the sand. Then with the help of friends on the shore they drew the net laboriously up the beach. As the enclosed space began to grow small there arose a violent commotion. The fish, divining danger, rushed in all directions against the walls of the net, and sprang high into the air. Nearer and nearer came the bag of the net to the shore, until the whole of the water was in a boil, and then [reek easm. ckerJ] began to leap over the edge into the outer water. The sight of this raised the excitement to fever pitch. The men, fearing to lose all, tugged till their faces purpled with the strain. Eager helpers rushed in to lend a hand at the edge of the net, add at last with a mighty heave the whole catch was laid high and dry on the sand, the pretty little butter fish streaming out of the meshes back into the sea like a river of molten silver. The sand was now alive with jumping, twisting, wriggling mackerel, all that were clear of the net trying their best to flop back to water. Fishermen, women, children, and even dogs rushed to prevent this, and threw themselves in a mass on the hapless mackerel, rushing into the water up to their knees, grabbing with their hands, scraping with their feet, and dashing sticks and stones into the water, all the while shouting at the utmost pitch of their voices, and wildly waving hands. Here a small child barely able to walk might be seen hugging a couple of lusty mackerel that in their struggles nearly upset the tiny fisher. Bigger children hooked the fish from the net when the owners' backs were turned, while others contented themselves with picking up the larger butterfish — some of them four inches long, but the majority about one inch — that bestrewed the beach. To vary the monotony sometimes a too eager friend, more willing than wise, would pull at the top edge of the net, with the result that the bottom of the net would rise, and then out would go the whole body of fish with a plunge. For this achievement the offender, if a boy, was soundly cuffed, and, if a man, cursed "up in heaps," as the saying goes, until the sight of another small shoal close in shore called all away once more. By this time the beach was fairly covered with sprats. The poor little fish, in their haste to get away from their merciless pursuers, literally flung themselves on the beach, and lay and flopped in hundreds on the wet sand. At times an over-eager mackerel would rush in too far, and find himself stranded when the tide receded. When this happened there was another rush by the children and the general crowd of loafers and onlookers, amongst whom "yours truly," as Mr. Foker would say, figured, and between the lot the fish was soon snapped up. Of course, every visitor in the district was on the spot enjoying the fun, while some of the ladies, with huge baskets, having been told that butter-fish are good to eat — as indeed they are — painfully gathered up little atoms of fish not an inch long.....The declining sun at last put an end to the sport.

Gwiberod Llansteffan

4 Hydref 1910:... I have a private residence - Underhill House [SA33 5JG] — at Llansteffan. In the afternoon of the 4th inst. [4 Hydref] my wife and only son and child, Vernon, age six years, and the nurse, Gwen Savies, and a maid-servant went off to Cwm Woods to gather blackberries. My wife and the nurse got separated from the other two, and presently heard an awful shriek. They eventually found the boy in tense agony. He said he had been bitten in the right leg by a snake. From the description given it was a viper a foot long.....

Bae Abermaw ...ddydd Gwener [31 Mai 1918] daliodd dau bysgotwr lleol bysgodyn elwir yn angelfish neu monkfish, math o forgi yn mesur pum troedfedd o hyd ac yn pwysod dros hanner o bwysau. Dinesydd Cymreig 5 June 1918

7 Tach 1895: A Peculiar Fish caught at Penarth. On Thursday morning [7 Tachwedd] last, Alfred Morgan, caught a peculiar fish, known as the Angler also called the fishing frog, frog fish, toadfish, goosefish, allmouth, monkfish, etc., but what was said to be a Shore-shark. The fish has a large, broad and depressed head...It has eleven rows of teeth, and weighs about 30 lbs and is about 3 feet long. When full grown these fish usually weigh about 60 lbs.



I've never seen one before and wondered how commonly they're observed. According to [Wikipedia](#) 'A fog bow is a similar phenomenon to a rainbow; however, as its name suggests, it appears as a bow in fog rather than rain. Because of the very small size of water droplets that cause fog—smaller than 0.05 millimeters (0.0020 in)—the fog bow has only very weak colors, with a red outer edge and bluish inner edge. In many cases when the droplets are very small, fog bows appear white, and are therefore sometimes called white rainbows.' Have you seen them?

We lunched just at the top of the Foxes path, as there was a good spring of water there, the spring at the top being dried up.... Dyddiadur hela CE Munro Edwards, Dolserau

Wedi yfed sawl tro o'r ffynnon ar ben ucha' Llwybr Madyn. Mae o 'chydig islaw'r llwybr fel y mae'n croesi o'r grib tuag at gopa'r Gadair. Dwr bendigedig. Byddai'n ddiddorol ei ddadansoddi. Mae'r dwr adre yn Nhroed y Gader yn dod o dwll 400 troedfedd. Ar ol mynnu cael taliad am 'studio map daearegol, fe dyllodd y cwmni drilio yn union i ganol yr haen o garreg haearn yn y mynydd (yr haen yr aeth Abraham Darby ar ei ol mae'n debyg), a daeth y dwr allan fel sudd oren, ac ynddo lefelau o hearn a manganis nad oedd y labordy cyhoeddus wedi gweld eu tebyg erioed! Ar ol hidlo'r dwr drwy rhyw danciau o dywod, mae'r lefelau wedi gostwng, ond yn ddidorol ddigon, yr hyn sydd gen i nawr ydy problem calch yn hel yn y tegell - yr un calch ac sydd efallai sy'n hel o gwmpas hydrothodau'r tormaen porffor uwchben Llyn Gafr, ac y mae'r *Neckera crispa* yr oedd Price Evans mor dda am ei ganfod yn dibynnu arno (roedd yn defnyddio presenoldeb hwn i gynghori gweithwyr yr Arolwg Daearegol Prydeinig ynghylch lleoliad y wythien basig ar y mynydd - yr un sy'n gorffen yn Allt y Benglog, Rhydymain (lle mae cen *Biatoridium monasteriense* yn tyfu ger Pistyll Hen Fynachlog!). A thybed a oes calch yn nŵr y ffynnon fach yma hefyd, sy'n rhoi rhyw felyster hyfryd iddo? Dwi'n amau mai dŵr o'r ffynnon yma oedd yn cael ei gario at ddefnydd y caffi ar y copa ers talwm (mae gweddillion yr hen le Tân yno hyd heddiw, yn sefyll yn unig iawn yr olwg ar fin y llwybr).

Postio gwiber i Henffordd!

THE PENNY POST A gentleman resident in this town [Henffordd?] received, a day or two ago [tua 24 Medi 1840], through the medium of the penny post, a living viper, from the foot of Cader Idris, in North Wales! It arrived safely, and was not at all the worse for its journey. The penny post thus affording the naturalist a very safe, and at the same time a very cheap, way of forwarding his specimens. 
I thought you may be interested in today's activities and photos. I went to **Tidbinbilla Nature Reserve**; a 25 minute drive from home. It's about 21 square miles in area and backs onto national parks. It was a dull day and a bit cool. Not much insect activity and not many birds active. It was too cool to get the reptiles moving but the cloud cover did encourage a platypus to show itself, although it kept its distance. A great disappointment was the excitement of a rare chance seeing the potoroo but being unable to take a clear photo through the vegetation. I have better photos of flame and yellow robins. I was pleased to see the **flame robin** as the purpose of my trip was to look for them. They are altitudinal migrants that come down to the Tidbinbilla and other valleys during winter. The yellow robins are always about. There was some snow on the higher peaks on Wednesday, although mostly gone when I went into the high country on Friday. There was a distinct drop in flame robin numbers at about 1400 metres but they're not yet in numbers at 1000 metres and below.
